Structure Governance and Management

The Trust was set up by Catherine and Peter Erskine and was recognised as a Scottish charity with effect from 21 July 1998. The Trust is administered in accordance with the terms of the Trust Deed.

Trustee Recruitment and Appointment

Appointment and removal of trustees is in accordance with the Trust Deed, which requires that appointment is approved by unanimous agreement of the existing trustees and removal of trustees by the unanimous agreement of the others. The charity has had a management committee of eight local trustees and one sessional worker funded by various grants.

During this period Freddie Craig and Andrew Wright resigned from the Trust and the following three new trustees were appointed:- Julie Otto, experienced sports coach and very supportive of the aims of the charity, Alex Marshall, trained accountant and lawyer, and Kathryn Jenkins, accountant and horticulturist.

Objectives and Activities

Cambo Heritage Trust was formed in 1998 to provide learning, training and volunteering opportunities in environment, heritage, arts, culture and horticulture at Cambo Estate. Demand for these opportunities has grown dramatically. Cambo Heritage Trust now wishes to safeguard the activities of the charity and differentiate them from activities run by the estate and will take a lease of the heritage buildings and gardens on the estate and make them fit for their charitable purposes to ensure an income for the future sustainability of the charity (The Cambo Stables Project).

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

Summary of the main activities in relation to these objectives

Cambo Heritage Trust was involved in the Soil and Sea Festival, in partnership with the Scottish Fisheries Museum. Catherine Cumming, the newly appointed Learning & Engagment Officer, developed workshops on Mesolithic Farming Practices and Soil Investigation which she delivered to local schools and was invited back to one to develop it further with an investigation in the school garden!

At the beginning of August, Shakespeare returned to Cambo with the ever-resourceful Handlebards and their bikes, this year performing A Midsummer Nights' Dream in the grounds of the estate to an audience of around 70.

The Cambo Canter, in its third year and now an established fun run for the family locally, has had to be postponed from the end of September to early October.

The Green Team providing environmental therapy for adults with support needs now meets twice weekly, led by Garry Coppin. They have taken over the Old Dairy as a base for activities and now use this a workshop for a Men's Sheds woodworking project.

The Inclusion Group, Dundee are involved in several regular activities – Green Team, work experience at Cambo House in housekeeping, woodland volunteering, and now the arts workshops. A pilot chutney-making session held at Cambo Farmhouse was very popular. The group has raised funding to purchase a mini-bus to enable them to bring more people more often. Their activities at Cambo immeasurably enhance the richness of their lives.

Catherine Cumming has started a kids' outdoor learning club for 6-12 year olds called the Adventurer's Club meeting every 3rd Saturday in the month.

A Butterfly Walk and Workshop took place in August as part of the Big Butterfly Count.

Creative Breaks Funding is in place to commence arts workshops in October for carers and the cared for. These will take place at Cambo Farmhouse until the North Courtyard of Cambo Stables is completed.

Ruthanne Baxter organised a series of Grey Matter talks over the winter on a range of topics which were all well received.

Ruthanne also organised another hugely popular Mad Hatter, Grey Matter Festival throughout a Saturday in July for people of all ages and ability and funded by Foundation Scotland.

The partnership with the East Neuk Festival continued again very successfully with two concerts in the potato barn and also the literary festival in Cambo House which focused on natural history and included a demonstration of falconry from Helen McDonald, author of H is for Hawk, about which she had already spoken. The Festival also featured the world premiere of John Luther Adams' piece Across the Distance with 32 horns and including both professional musicians and a number of young people learning the horn.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the financial period

HLF agreed to give permission to start on the glasshouses, phasing them in to allow criteria of funders.

The lease is now in its final form and will be signed when the trust is in a position to be able to fund the salaries. The trust has agreed all the details with Cambo Estate who has undertaken to grant the lease on these terms and conditions when the trust is in a position to accept the responsibility of it.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

The architects have been working throughout the year to prepare the drawings and reports necessary to fulfil the criteria for a building warrant and conditions of planning. The board agreed a timetable of activities and that the architects should take the main project to tender so that they would be received back by the middle of January 2016.

Plans for the interpretation of the stables have taken great strides forward with Lesley Bowditch of Studioarc based on the research done by our volunteers across the summer and using the archive material which has been worked on by Trustees Robin Evetts and Jo Roger.

The charity has been registered for VAT.

Significant funding has been secured from Historic Scotland.

Funding from Creative Scotland provided money for an arts consultant. Helen Terry is now in this post and has created a lengthy, detailed Arts Strategy which will take the Trust well into the future.

Funding also led to the appointment of Catherine Cumming on 29 June as Learning and Engagement Officer, initially on a part-time basis, but full time from the beginning of September. Catherine has organised several outdoor learning activities over the summer, achieved a lot of valuable networking with schools and local organisations, and is undertaking Forest Education training for children.

With funding available, it was decided to advertise for an Events and Development Officer (Keri Ivins started in this role on 4 January).

Financial Review

The results for the period are shown in the statement of financial activities. There was a surplus in the year of £15,187 on the general fund. £262,067 of capital work and professional fees have been included in prepayments pending completion.

Reserves policy

It is the intention of Trustees to hold reserves of six month's operating costs.

Risk Management

Due to the size and structure of the charity the trustees consider they have adequate measures in place to manage risk which results mainly from ensuring that adequate funding is in place to complete each step of work.

Donated Facilities and Services

Cambo Institute has paid Cambo Estate for services provided during the year as clearly identified in the accounts but this does not cove estate time donated in kind by Peter Erskine, Catherine Erskine and Fay Smith and use of vehicles, equipment etc. The cost of the professional fundraiser is paid with money donated by Ann, Lady Erskine.

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 SEPTEMBER 2015

Statement of trustees responsibilities

1 Accounting policies

1.1 Accounting convention

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, modified to include donated assets at market value, and in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities, applicable accounting standards and the Companies Act 2006.

The company has taken advantage of the exemption in Financial Reporting Standard No 1 from the requirement to produce a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is a small company.

1.2 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are recognised when receivable.

1.3 Resources expended

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and is recognised where the is a legal and constructive obligation to pay for expenditure.

Prepaid expenditure includes professional fees and costs relating to property alterations that have not yet commenced.

1.4 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
